




#### Which months does your rugby season take place?




Is there an opportunity for pupils to choose formats of Rugby other than full contact?


In which year groups is there an opportunity for pupils to choose to discontinue Rugby of any type, and to choose a different activity instead?






### Most boys are as enthusiastic about the game as ever



### Themes from Additional Comments

- Parental injury concerns, esp concussion
- Difficulty of creating workable fixture programme
- Issues caused by range of formats
- Problems of staffing/refereeing concerns/access to training
- RFU structures (esp Reg15) restrictive and inconsistently applied
- Demand for alternatives from parents of less keen pupils
- Keen and able are as enthusiastic as ever

### Conclusions?

- Enthusiastic pupils are as enthusiastic about the game as ever
- Rugby-facing parents largely continue to support the game
- Parents are often more injury aware than players
- More girls are playing all formats of the game than ever before
- Pupils unenthusiastic about Rugby increasingly expect alternatives
- Touch provides a way of maintaining wide participation
- Appropriate competition is harder to find
- Fewer staff are enthusiastic about coaching and especially refereeing
   Maintaining Rugby programmes is becoming harder
